"For the past four years, John Doe Smith has volunteered 20 hours a week at the Fayette County Senior Center where he delights the lunchtime crowd with the sounds of classical and jazz piano solos. He also has been a foster grandparent for thousands of young people with no father figure to turn to. John, who often was the only caring adult the youths had ever met, single-handedly combated the risk factors of poverty, broken families, poor education, and a high-crime environment with his brand of mentorship, understanding, and sound moral advise. John has been the mainstay of the Foster Grandparent Organization for nearly two decades. He received the "Good Hands Award" in 1997, the "Fayette County Elder Citizen of the Year Awards" in 1999 and he has also received many accolades from the Florida Senate and civic organizations throughout Fayette County. In addition to his current volunteering, John served as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Peru from 1963 to 1966."
